OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Bhubaneswar dated the 1.8.1995.

Sub: Abolition of the system of departmental execution of work

The undersigned is directed to say that the Engineering Departments are authorised as per Appendix-XXXIII of the O.P.W.D. Code Vol.II, for departmental execution of works costing upto Rs.1.00 lakhs in case of original works and repair work without any financial limit vide Works Department O.M.No.26178, dt.14.10.87. This system of work execution ultimately resulted in huge payments through Hand-Receipts & irregularities have been committed by way of advances to various field functionaries.

These aspects were viewed with deep concern and after careful consideration, Government have been pleased to decided that the Departmental execution of work should not be taken up hence forward. However in exceptional circumstances which warrant such execution and when such execution is absolutely necessary, reasons for the same is to be recorded with prior permission of the concerned authorities before taking up such execution.

The power of according permission for execution of works departmentally in such cases shall be as follows:-

ESTIMATED COST OF HE WORK

AUTHORITY COMPETENT TO
ACCORD PERMISSION

1. Works costing upto Rs.5.00 Lakh
2. Works costing above Rs.5.00 lakhs
& upto Rs.15.00 lakh

Chief Engineer concerned.

Administrative Deptt.

3. Works costing morethan Rs.15.00 lakhs

Finance Department

The estimate for the works to be executed departmentally shall be prepared on a realistic basis as per the current schedule of rate. For a fair assessment of reasonable rates, where the current schedule of rate is un-workable due to higher rates prevailing in the local market a committee of S.Es. in each District shall be constituted by Works Department. The Superintending Engineer, from R&B Wing shall function as Convenor the Committee. Another two members of the Committee shall be taken either from National Highway, Rural works, Public Health and Irrigation Wing having their jurisdiction over that district to review the local rates of labour, conveyance and materials which are not ordinarily available in the stock of the Division, entrusted with the work to be taken up departmentally.

In case of upward assessment of rates by the Committee, it shall be workable after the same is accepted by the authority competent to accord permission for execution of the work departmentally.

The estimate so prepared shall be administratively approved & technically sanctioned, where necessary by the competent authority under the relevant codal provision before taking up actual execution.

In order to review the execution of works departmentally the following quarterly returns need to be furnished by the Chief Engineers to be concerned Administrative Department.

1. The list of work executed departmentally indicating the name of works.
2. The Divisions under which the works have been done.
3. Estimated cost of each project (Division-wise).
4. Justification for departmental execution.

The Administrative Department shall take up the review on receipt of the return from the Chief Engineer and shall place the matter before Government for information with their observations and a copy of such report shall be made available to Finance Department.

Works Department shall amend Appendix-XXXIII of the O.P.W.D. Code accordingly.
